Medical Services

GLRC Medical Services are available to the general public and offered in a variety of locations throughout the Upper Peninsula. These programs are staffed by a physician and nurse practitioners who can provide preventative care, education on health topics and treatment. Days and times of availability depend upon the location, however, the medical staff are also available via the use of telehealth services in some locations.

Primary Services

GLRC provides the following primary medical services to current GLRC clients, as well as community members:

- Chronic Disease Management
- Family Planning
- Family Practice
- Integrated Behavioral Health and Physical Health Care
- Minor illness and Injury
- Routine physicals
- Women's Health

Specialty Services

GLRC provides a variety of specialty health care services.

These services are available to current GLRC clients as well as community members.

Dermatology

On the fourth Tuesday of every month at the Negaunee Integrated Care Clinic, GLRC offers a dermatology clinic to all members of the community. Clients do not need to be receiving other GLRC services to attend the dermatology clinic. The Dermatology Clinic accepts many insurance carriers including Medicaid. Appointments are required. To schedule an appointment call (906) 485-2347.

Hepatitis C

Hepatitis C is a disease of the liver that can be life-threatening if left untreated. As a communicable disease, Hepatitis C can be passed on to others. However, Hepatitis C is curable. The providers at GLRC can assist adults with screening for this disease and if diagnosed, provide treatment or an appropriate referral. Hepatitis C treatment is available at both our Marquette and Negaunee outpatient clinics.

Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)

Medication assisted treatment, combined with counseling, has been shown to be effective in the treatment of opioid disorders. GLRC's Medication Assisted Treatment clinic provides medication that can help control cravings and the chemical impacts of substances. The target population for this treatment program includes adult clients dealing with moderate to severe Opioid and/or Alcohol Use Disorder. Clients will be thoroughly screened to assess risk and appropriateness for compliance with all program rules and guidelines. Only those patients who can fully comply with the established program components will be accepted for treatment.

Opioid Health Home

Opioid Health Home (OHH) is a program that consists of an interdisciplinary team of providers that help to coordinate, support and assist individuals who have been diagnosed with an Opioid Use Disorder. Clients in the OHH program may receive any combination of services including medical, mental health, substance use disorder, peer recovery and community resource services to provide person-centered care. The Nurse Care Manager will work with the client to identify behavioral and physical health needs and identify goals for treatment. By doing this, the Nurse Care Manager will be able to assist the client with the management of all integrated care needs including primary and specialty medical, behavioral health, housing, educational, vocational, transportation and other community services.

Ostomy Care

Ostomies are used for many health conditions and can range from temporary to permanent. GLRC staff will help you through each step of your ostomy journey from pre-operative assessment through surgery, aftercare, and recovery. In most cases, ostomies improve health and lead to one's ability to enjoy life again after serious illness. GLRC staff can help with logistical concerns, such as ordering supplies, identify a caregiver networks, work with dietary considerations and offer an emotional support network and advocacy, taking into account your lifesyle, responsibilities, goals, interests and dreams.

Other Services

Outpatient Counseling

Outpatient services are the first option for those seeking counseling, but need the freedom to continue working or going to school. Outpatient services are also used as follow-up for clients who have completed residential services. For more information call (906) 228-9696.

GLRC works with returning parolees in the UP to assist with the transition back into the community through our program of resources and case management services. For more information call (906) 458-0616.

Prevention Services
